MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF DEDDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 21ST MAY 1986

Present: Councillor Ward (Chairman), Councillors Cole, Fenemore, Fuller, Garrett, Garvey, Hayward, Marmion, O'Neill, Stevens and Webber.

1. To elect a Chairman for the ensuing year It was moved by Councillor Garrett, seconded by Councillor O'Neill and unanimously RESOLVED that Councillor Hayward be elected Chairman of the Council for the ensuing year.

Councillor Hayward then signed his Declaration of Acceptance of Office and took the Chair

RESOLVED that a vote of thanks be recorded to Councillor Ward, the outgoing Chairman for the way in which he had conducted proceedings during the past year.

- 2. To elect a Vice-chairman for the ensuing year It was moved by Councillor Garrett, second by Councillor Stevens and unanimously RESOLVED that Councillor Fenemore be elected Vice-chairman of the Council for the ensuing year.
- 3. Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on 23rd April 1986, which had been previously circulated, were confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.
- 1. Result of the Election The Clerk reported on the result of the Election, when there were only ten candidates for fourteen vacancies, as set out in the appendix to these Minutes. He also reported that all Members had made the necessary Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

5. Matters arising from the Minutes

Playgroup fence The Clerk reported that Mr. Ward had remedied the defects and that everything now appeared to be in order.

Cottage and garage adjoining Holcombe Cottage The Clerk reported that an appeal had been made against this Planning refusal.

Horton Hospital Replies from the member of Parliament and the Oxfordshire Health Authority which stressed, inter alia, the need for parishes such as Deddington to use the Horton Hospital in preference to the John Radcliffe more often.

Circuses The need to encourage suitable circuses was mentioned by a Member.

Use of Town Hall canopy The Clerk reported that Mr. Langstaff would be holding his exhibition on 21st June.

Bus services A letter from the member of Parliament was reported.

The Stonepit, Hempton Road It was noticed that this rubble was still there and RESOLVED that the District Council be advised accordingly.

- 6. <u>Dates and times of Meetings</u> RESOLVED that Meetings be held on the fourth Wednesday in each month at 7.15 p.m., with the exception of December (third Wednesday) and August on which a decision would be made in July.
- 7. Membership of Planning Committee RESOLVED that the members of the Planning Committee be the Chairman, Vice-chairman and Councillors Garrett, Garvey, O'Neill and Stevens and that meetings be held in the Town Hall whenever practicable.
- 8. Post Office Advisory Committee The Chairman stated that he could no longer serve on this Committee and Councillor Cole was nominated in his place.

9. Items of correspondence

Footway lighting The Clerk reported that the Electricity Board were giving a rebate for the period a lamp was unlit in St. John's Way.

Thames Water Consumer Consultative Committee RESOLVED that Mr. F.M. Hunt of Mayfield, Earls Lane, Deddington be nominated for membership of this Committee

10. Windmill Centre

Lessees RESOLVED that Mrs. Mary Robinson, Commander Robert S. Forsyth R.N. (Retired), and Group Captain Denys Heywood R.A.F. (Retired), all of whom had consented, be asked to act as lessees within the terms of the management deed for the Centre.

Financial working group RESOLVED that the present membership be asked to continue with the addition of Councillor Cole. Councillor O'Neill expressed some misgivings with the way the group conducted its affairs and he and Councillor Cole were asked to report to each meeting on any problems which they might encounter. Further RESOLVED that the need to keep minutes be impressed upon the group.

Progress report The Clerk reported that the Sports Council wished to present a plaque to commemorate its association with the venture and RESOLVED that this be formally presented at the Official Opening, the date of which had still to be agreed between the Council and the committee. Further RESOLVED that the application of the Cricket Club for financial assistance from the District Council be supported.

11. Planning Committee reported that they had met and had no objection to four detached dwellings with a new access at the rear of Maunds Farmhouse, or to alterations at The Corner House, Hempton, or the new agricultural access to Stonepits, Hempton Road, but felt that the new proposal to re-site Manor Farmhouse, Deddington, although preferable to the previous one was still premature. Arising therefrom, RESOLVED that the District Council be asked to consider "listing" the existing Manor Farmhouse.

12. Planning applications

(a) The Grove It was noted that there was no adequate site plan, the density was too high, there was a poor access to A423 and inadequate Parking space.

(b) <u>Single dwellinghouse</u>, <u>Castle Street</u> The access on a dangerous bend was considered poor and the development also out of keeping with the existing development.
