Correspondence

Residents of Gaveston Gardens have asked the PC for permission to undertake professional tree works to the Oak Tree nearing their properties. It is not understood who this tree belongs to but the PC offer no objection on the understanding that there is no cost implication to the PC and that OCC are consulted.

188/16 Highways and Transport report

- 1. **Thames Valley Police.** Speeding enforcement was carried out in the Hempton road.
- 2. Speed Watch. The SID remains broken. TVP unable therefore to offer any dates.
- 3. **Clifton Mill complaint from owner.** The owner of Clifton Mill has agreed to fund a traffic volume and speed monitoring survey up to £100 which will be placed in the vicinity of Clifton Mill at the start of the new scholastic year. A site meeting is being arranged with OCC to discuss further options to both warn and slow down/reduce collision risk.
- 4. **Road Traffic Collision.** It was noted that a serious RTC occurred in July at the traffic lights. The PC will ask for an update about all accidents that occur in in the vicinity of the lights.
- 5. **Damage to road signs after RTC**. Two road signs that were damaged following the RTC have yet to be repaired. Fix my street have been contacted and a works order has been issued. Cllr J Higham joined the meeting at this point.
- 6. **Re-phasing of pedestrian crossing lights**. County Cllr A Fatemian agreed to ask for the default setting of the pedestrian crossing to be increased by one or two seconds to enable the elderly to cross safely.
- 7. **Farmers Market.** The chair of the Farmers Market has been invited to attend a September H&TWG meeting to discuss his concerns around parking issues.
- 8. **Resident concerns around traffic issues**. The PC was made aware of a residents traffic concerns. Northampton County Council have been passed concerns regarding the Clifton to Aynho Wharf road. The Clerk will ask OCC to renovate the 'Give Way' road marking near Castle Street which have become faded. TVP have been made aware of concerns about parking in this area. Cllr S O'Neill, lives nearby and so will canvass local residents and report back. County Cllr A Fatemian was asked to confirm the cost of painting yellow lines and half and daily crew rates.
- 9. HGV'S. The OCC Highways Enforcement team intend to conduct weight restriction checks.
- 10. **Traffic Lights.** The batteries have been changed again and these should last a year. H&TWG will continue to monitor the phasing and traffic flow.

Transport: The Oxfordshire Comet: One thousand leaflets have been received regarding the new bookable service. These will be distributed to all residents.

Meeting with David Wilson Homes: David Wilson Homes have contacted the PC to see if they would like to meet. Cllr H Oldfield proposed, Cllr D Anderson seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (eight for and one abstention) that a meeting takes place under the usual caveats. The Clerk to arrange an evening meeting.

190/16 **Update of meeting with Village Foundation**: A meeting has taken place with The Village Foundation who work as middle men between villagers and developers. They floated suggestions on behalf of a local landowner, who had not been involved in the Neighbourhood Planning, of development of approximately 3 hectares on the corner of Earls Lane and down Clifton Road either side of Home Farm (DE003, DE035 and DE045). There was also a mention of sports fields to the North of Old School Grounds. The Planning group will consider whether this needs to be an Agenda item for the September meeting.

	 Flooring quote adjustment. The quote for flooring totalling £4,100 that was received and approved included an error. The gross figures had been transposed incorrectly and instead of £3,416, £3,146 was noted. Therefore, the difference needs to be agreed to. There were also two additional costs. One was for £95 for flooring removal. The other was for a mat that the Windmill Committee will pay for. Cllr B Wood proposed, Cllr D Anderson seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that these costs of approximately £400 be approved and paid. Interior decoration adjustment. The PC agreed to purchase the paint for the works on the Windmill Community Centre based upon the £500 estimate provided by the contractor. However this was an underestimation of the number of coats of paint required and resulted in the project being overspent. The Windmill Committee have agreed to pay £260 for additional works to the toilets and kitchen but there remains a shortfall of approximately £911. Cllr B Wood proposed, Cllr J Watts seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that the PC agree a maximum budget of no more than £1,000 to cover the cost of additional paint and other materials.
