Cllr J Watts proposed, Cllr M Swadling seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that the Clerk write to the company to ensure that there is no time limit for use of the marquee given that a deposit was paid in 2020. Once a response has been given the Council will consider use of marquee hire. b) Entrance gate signage. Cllr J Watts proposed, Cllr M Robinson seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) to purchase a second sign for the entrance gate at a cost of up to £100 + VAT. It was also agreed that Rob Kelly of TVP would be given a key to the entrance gate. c) Bike Rack. Cllr M Robinson proposed, Cllr M Cox seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (seven for and one abstention) approved purchase of bike rack up to £285 + VAT. d) Community Orchard. Cllr M Swadling proposed, Cllr T Timms seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) to pay for associated works for Welford's Piece orchard that will be covered by TOE grant of £2,167 and reclaim when monies are spent. e) Consider response to District-wide Community Governance review regarding boundaries. Cllr H Oldfield proposed, Cllr J Watts seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that the Council would respond that it is happy with the status quo. f) Tree works. Cllr H Oldfield proposed, Cllr J Watts seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that two days of recommended tree works are undertaken at a cost of £490 per day + VAT. g) Venue for September meeting. 172/21	<p>Planning Report.</p> <p>Applications</p> <p>a) 21/02593/F 28 The Daedings, Deddington. Two storey and part single rear extension. Cllr M Swadling proposed, Cllr M Cox seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) objection on the grounds of overdevelopment, too close to neighbours boundary, rear balcony overlooking neighbours property.</p> <p>b) 21/02462/OBL Land West of Wimborn Close, Deddington. Discharge of schedule 2 (affordable housing scheme). Cllr J Watts proposed, Cllr T Timms seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) objection To maintain continuity in the parish the Council asks that there is no flowerbed but that the planter is moved westward along with the Deddington sign and the 30mph roundel.</p> <p>Cllr S O'Neill left the meeting</p> <p>c) 21/02417/F Land Adjoining and West Of Stonecroft House Clifton Road Deddington Variation of Condition 2 (plans) of 20/03467/F Variation of design layout to accommodate the CDC condition regarding equality act compliance. Each property is now M3 compliant, and a maintenance store has been added to the plans. Cllr M Swadling proposed, Cllr M Cox seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) no objection.</p> <p>Cllr S O'Neill returned to the meeting and Cllr J Higham joined the meeting.</p> <p>d) Draft Statement of Community Involvement. Cllr J Watts proposed, Cllr S O'Neill seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (eight for and one abstention) that the Council respond as follows: Deddington Parish Council would like CDC and Oxfordshire Clinical Commissioning Group to review the existing supplementary planning document on developer contributions to ensure that it is fit for purpose and will deliver the funding required to expand primary care delivery across Cherwell. Also, that OCCG are required to create a plan for the expansion of primary care with the evidence needed to allow planning officer to secure the S106 contributions necessary. Whilst the pooling and time parameters have been relaxed it would be useful to ensure the funding model in the SPD reflects the full costs of delivering additional primary care facilities to ensure primary can expand and service levels are maintained. It was also requested that informing residents of planning applications should continue to be by both letter and notices. To rely on notices solely would be discriminatory to those who are house bound or those with limited mobility. 174/21	<p>Large Scale Developments Working Group.</p> <p>a) Consideration of road name suggestions for housing west of Wimborn Close. Cllr J Watts proposed, Cllr S O'Neill seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that the street names that the Council would put forward would be Hobart Close (the Council's first choice) and Fardon Way (as its second choice).</p> <p>b) Land west of Wimborn Close to consider request to leave soil on site. Cllr C Cox proposed, Cllr A Collins seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (eight for and one abstention) that the Council respond that they support, in principle, the height increase but would like to understand if there are any serious technical reason(s) why CDC objected so that the Council may make a better-informed decision.</p> <p>c) To consider request to purchase land at Clifton. Cllr S O'Neill proposed, Cllr M Swadling seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that the Council would not consider the offer.</p>

175/21	<p>Highways and Transport. – Cllr M Cox</p> <p>a) Fly tipping at the Town Hall. The Steward to identify names and addresses of packaging left at the Town Hall so as to report as fly tipping.</p> <p>b) Developers Sign. Cllr M Cox dealt with a sign obstructing Mill Close which the Site Manager promptly relocated.</p> <p>c) Hempton Road commercial sign opposite Mill Close. Complaints that this sign obstructs the view from Windmill Street. The Clerk to contact OCC for further investigation.</p>
176/21	<p>Environment and Recreation Working Group – Cllr M Robinson.</p> <p>a) Tree planting at Wimborn Close. Wimborn Close residents have planted four trees near access gate, north end of Close. Whole strip including gate owned by M&G, not PC. Cllr M Robinson proposed, Cllr S O'Neill seconded the motion and the Council RESOLVED (unanimous) that the Clerk write to the resident with this information.</p> <p>b) Gaveston Garden brambles. Quote to be sourced to cut back in autumn.</p> <p>c) Litter pick. To be held early November. One resident was thanked for asking for litter picking gear to clear some rubbish on her walks. Residents may also do so by contact Cllr J Watts or the Clerk.</p> <p>d) Trees. Cllr M Robinson has started research on the possibility of planting suitable trees to provide shade and to add to the general amenity value in the adventure playground, and to replace dead trees along the Hempton Road, to support the national tree planting effort.</p>
177/21	<p>Deddington Environment Network – update by Cllr H Oldfield on behalf of Cllr J Eames</p> <p>The Clerk has signed off the grant agreement. The planting day has been set for Saturday 16 October with public participation welcome. There are 15 fruit trees, made up of 10 apple and two pear, two plum and one medlar. Parishioners to be invited to support the orchard with donations for the future maintenance and development of the orchard as a wildlife-friendly open space.</p>
