DEDDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held at the Town Hall, Deddington on Wednesday, 13th March, 1996 commencing at 7.30 pm.

Present: - Councillors Todd (Chairman), Mrs Brewer, Clarke, Clinch, Drake, Mrs Fisher, Flux, Miss Hill, Mrs Lee, Oddy, Mrs Stevens and Mrs Swash. County Councillor N Matthews in attendance.

147/95 Apologies for Absence.

Apologies were received from Crs Cosgrove and Colley and District Councillor O'Sullivan.

148/95 Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 21st February, 1996.

The minutes were approved as a true record and signed by the Chairman subject to the addition of an apology from Cr Oddy and the insertion of an interest rate of 3.625% in Min.143/95.

149/95 Matters arising.

The Chairman reported that no member was able to attend the Community Plan meeting on 12th March. However members would attend subsequent meetings on either 19th or 28th March.

The Clerk thanked Members for their card and good wishes regarding his recent operation

150/95 Any other business.

The Chairman allowed the following items:-

Cr Clarke - Representative School Governor and

Cr Flux - state of footpaths in village.

151/95 Quotations for Works

The Chairman moved, and it was agreed unanimously, that this item be discussed in private session at the end of the meeting, as, due to its financial nature, it would be prejudicial to the public interest to discuss it in open session.

√152/95 Deddington Millenium Wood.

The Clerk reported that pledges received were still £1,809 short of the £9,000 target but an anonymous donor was willing to match any contribution made by the Parish Council as he had done with the contribution from the World WildLife Fund for Nature. The local branch of WWF were very keen to see the project proceed and had undertaken to continue to fundraise on its behalf. 77 pledges had been received representing almost 10% of households in the village, but this was said by a member to indicate only a minority support for the project. Various suggestions of loans and grants were made and Cr Clinch moved that an interest free loan be made of a sum which would enable the project to proceed which was seconded by Cr Mrs Brewer. The motion was approved by 7 votes to 3.

(Note- It has since been confirmed that the aforementioned anonymous donor will match the contribution by way of



underwriting and, taking into account a further pledge of £25, the Council's requiremnt to underwrite the scheme has been reduced to £892.)

153/95 Coat of Arms Committee

Cr Oddy reported upon a financial statement prepared by the Clerk, (a copy of which is filed in the Minute Book) which showed a current overspending of £1,617.68 on the project but there were unsold stocks of 17 Silver Spoons, 5 Videos and an unknown quantity of Tankards which when sold would, significantly reduce the deficit. Discussion proceeded on the means of realising the stocks and it was agreed that local retailers and hoteliers be approached in this matter.

154/95 Environment Committee.

Cr Mrs Brewer reported as follows:-

(a) Tree surgery High and New Streets. A meeting was to be held between the County Council, their contractor and herself on 15th March and any interested frontager was welcome to attend. (b) Clifton Footpath. A letter had been forwarded to our Euro MP requesting a capital grant for this project. Cr Matthews stated that the OCC were to spray the path this Spring and undertake further minor works, but Council were of the view that the surface would be far from satisfactory for the use of

(c) Clifton Car Parking. PC Donahue had been informed of the

problem and was prepared to investigate.

(d) The Time Capsule had been duly buried on 29th February, 1996 and the Council's contribution of £30 made to Katherine House Hospice.

(e) Draft Dog Control Byelaws had been received from the District Council which the Committee were assessing prior to

making recommendations.

(f) Best Kept Village Competition. No response had been received from either Clifton or Hempton and it was proposed that Deddington be entered in the medium sized village category and that the War Memorial Competition be also entered. The proposal was agreed by 7 votes to 3.

(g) Closure of Chapel Square. Notification had been received from the County Council of the closure of Chapel Square on Sunday and Monday, 17th & 18th March for urgent sewer works to take place. The alternative route was either by Philcote St and Hopcraft Lane or by Church Street. Council were of the view that such diversions would create difficulty, particularly on Monday and suggested that the Clerk take up the matter with the County Council citing Earls Lane as a preferable diversion.

155/95 Planning Committee.

√96/0088TCA New Street and High Street - Fell 1 Cherry Tree, repollard 2 Lime Trees and maintenance work to 26 other Trees. CDC would encourage the replacement of the felled cherry tree. Public Toilets

Cr Miss Hill together with Crs Mrs Brewer and Clinch had met Mr Mellotti of CDC and questioned him regarding the maintenance of toilets which is one of his responsibilities at Cherwell. It was apparent that the costs of maintenance were considerable and that the District Council were looking to close such facilities rather than open new ones. Cr Miss Hill proposed and Cr Clinch seconded that the scheme for developing the toilets at the Town Hall be dropped and local hostelries and cafes be so informed and requested to assist tourists etc. This motion was accepted unanimously and also the provision of a frost stat to the existing toilet as an addition to the Town Hall repairs contract.

156/95 Recreation Committee.

Cr Drake had no report to make.

157/95 Windmill Committee.

. Cr Flux reported that the Centre was continuing to be well used and that the recent Dickens Evening went very well. In regard to the finances of the Centre provisional figures for the year ended 31st January, 1996 showed income of £11,800 and expenditure of £11,200 which latter figure included £3,500 of repairs and upgrades.

In connection with the previous discussion regarding the Badminton Club he had made certain calculations as to the return on capital being achieved, which, based upon the insured value of the Centre, showed a return of less than 0.5% - certainly not a commercial proposition.

Cr Flux again drew attention to the Open Day to be held on 27th May at which it was hoped that most village organisations would be represented.

Cr Oddy referred to the grant application by the Badminton Club which had been left in abeyance pending detail relating to the return on capital. Cr Clinch moved, seconded by Cr Miss Hill that a grant of £200 be made for the purchase of equipment for members aged 16 and under thus following the Council's policy of giving assistance to junior sport. The motion was agreed unanimously.

158/95 Accounts for Payment.

Accounts totalling £8,658.69, in accordance with a schedule circulated at the meeting, were approved for payment.

159/95 Investment of the Council's Funds.

The Clerk reported that at close of business on 12th March, 1996 the balances were as follows:-

160/95 Correspondence.

(a) Letter from Mrs Price of South Ridge complaining about the height of the conifer trees in her neighbour's garden which were blocking the light to her house and causing her to frequently have her gutters emptied. The Clerk had informed her that this was a matter purely between her herself and her neighbour to whom she should make further requests as the Council, though sympathetic, had no powers to intervene.

(b) Request for the Council to renew its membership of the National Association of Local Councils for 1996/97 at a cost of £179 plus £8.95 for a year's subscription to Local Council Review. Resolved that the membership be renewed plus one

subscription to the L C Review.

(c) Letter from the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers offering to spend 2 weekends, probably in October, to clear the footpath and surrounds in the part of the Castle Grounds owned by the Council. The cost for the 2 weekends would be £380 subject to the volunteers being accommodated overnight at the Windmill Centre. Resolved that the offer be accepted.

(d) Letter from Mr C Smith of The Daedings expressing his concern that the proprietor of the Kings Arms has been allowed to display the Parish Council's Coat of Arms on the Public House fascia. The Parish Council by Minute 116/93 agreed to

make charges as follows:-

" To use of the Arms by

Deddington Clubs and Societies £50
Deddington Business Firms £100".

Payment by the Kings Arms of the fee of £100 was made in April last year and the use of the Arms is therefore in accordance with Council policy. Resolved that Mr Smith be so informed.

161/95 Any Other Business.

(a) Cr Clarke reported that due to his commitments he was no longer able to represent the Council as a governor of the Primary School. He had contacted Cr Colley who had expressed an interest in assuming such responsibility. Resolved that Cr Clarke be thanked for his work for the school and, subject to his agreement, Cr Colley become the Council's representative governor.

(b) Cr Flux expressed his concern about the condition of footpaths in the village particularly where scaffolding has been erected for repairs etc. to adjacent buildings. The problem was one of litter, parking of vehicles and access for prams and wheel chairs. Resolved that the Clerk write to the



contractors concerned pointing out the problems and requesting that they bear in mind the problems being created and do their best to eliminate them.

162/95 Date of Next Meeting.

Minutes of the Closed Session of the Council Meeting on 13th March, 1996

163/95 Quotations for Works.

(a) Repairs to Town Hall.
Three quotations had been requested but one firm declined to quote. Quotations received were

J Spencer £4,938 plus VAT H R Gibbs & Son £5,570 plus VAT.

A further quotation had been delivered to the Clerk today but had not been opened. Resolved that as the above prices had been presented to Council at the previous meeting the envelope be not opened. Resolved that the quotation of J Spencer be accepted with a contract duration of 1 month. Work could commence once the SEB had completed the erection of the new Street Lights on the Town Hall.

(b) Repairs to Parish Church Clock.

A further quotation requested by the Environment Committee had not been received and they wished to consider this in conjunction with the 2 received. A letter had been received from Mr Walsh indicating that between November 1994 and December 1995 he had visited the clock on 43 occasions the majority of which were to adjust the time, but 6 visits were to replace and adjust the winding gear switches which had been bought on behalf of the Church. He indicates that repairs were not part of the free service but would be at a reduced rate as agreed and that it would be as well to leave the invoicing until such time as the clock is in proper working order. It was agreed that the further quotation be taken into account when received but that Mr Walsh be asked to render his account for the works of repair as soon as possible.

/ (c) Annual Maintenance Works - Windmill Field and Surrounds.

Quotations received were as follows:-

the same price. Previous work by the OCC Commercial Services
had been below standard and in the circumstances it was

contract be awarded to DesignGro of Adderbury.


(d) Grasscutting - Castle Grounds Field - 1996.
