

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF DEDDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 25TH MAY 1988

Present: Councillor Fenemore (Chairman), Councillors Cole, Fuller, Garrett, Garvey, Gibbs, Hayward, Marmion, Stevens, Mrs. Swash and Webber.

Apologies for absence were submitted on behalf of Councillors O'Neill and Mrs. Kedge.

1. To elect a Chairman for the ensuing year It was moved by Councillor Garrett, seconded by Councillor Marmion and unanimously RESOLVED that Councillor Cole be elected Chairman of the Council for the ensuing year.

The retiring Chairman thanked Members for their help for what had been a difficult year.

Councillor Cole then signed his Declaration of Acceptance of Office and took the Chair.

RESOLVED that a vote of thanks be recorded to Councillor Fenemore, the retiring Chairman for the way in which he had conducted proceedings during the past year.

2. To elect a Vice-chairman for the ensuing year It was moved by Councillor Mrs. Swash and seconded by Councillor Webber that Councillor Marmion be elected Vice-chairman for the ensuing year: it was also moved by Councillor Fenemore and seconded by Councillor Garrett that Councillor Hayward be elected. On a show of hands RESOLVED that Councillor Hayward be elected Vice-chairman for the ensuing year.

3. Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on 27th April 1988, which had been previously circulated, were confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

4. Matters arising from the Minutes

Village Theatre Workshops It was noted that the Home-School Association were not now proceeding with this venture.

Bridleway No. 16 It was noted that this and other bridleways and footpaths would be signposted as soon as possible.

Cherwell in Bloom Councillor Mrs. Swash reported that the cost of three hanging baskets for the Town Hall would be £21 and RESOLVED that these be purchased.

5. Dates and times of Meetings RESOLVED that Meetings be held on the fourth Wednesday in each month at 7.15 p.m., with the exception of December on which a decision would be made in November.

6. Membership of Planning Committee RESOLVED that the members of this Committee be the Chairman, Vice-chairman and Councillors Fenemore, Garrett, Garvey, O'Neill and Stevens.

7. Items of correspondence

Town Hall It was noted that the Department of the Environment had now included the building in the statutory list of buildings of special architectural or historic interest. Permission was given for the Clock Appeal Fund to erect a temporary scaffolding on the south-western corner for 25th June provided no damage was caused to the fabric and it was removed after the event. Councillor Stevens declared an interest in this matter.

No Waiting Order Progress on the implementation was reported.

Weight Restriction on B4031 Progress was also reported.

Deddington Health Centre The Clerk reported that the Planning application for the new cottage, which the Council had objected to, had been approved.

Next to Manor Farm House, Clifton The Clerk reported that the Planning application for a dwelling, for which this Council had no objections, had been refused as being unsympathetic to Manor Farm House.

7. Items of correspondence (continued)

Deddington Charity Estates Receipt of the accounts was reported.
Proposed Minerals Policies It was reported that the County Council was reviewing its policies, but did not appear to affect Deddington.
OALC Circular Receipt was reported, including a leaflet on Banbury Community Transport Association which involved a mini-bus.

8. Skip service It was reported that the District Council proposed to start a pilot service for refuse but the Council did not think there was an appropriate place in the Parish for it to be sited.

9. Castle Grounds parking area The Council had had circulated notes on the proposals of the Forestry Adviser, together with a letter alleging ownership of the access road. The Clerk also circulated a letter from the Chief Planning and Development Officer concerning the Planning aspects. RESOLVED that the matter be deferred until the ownership position is determined.

10. Windmill Community Centre

Defects in hall RESOLVED that the letter from the architect be circulated for consideration at the June meeting.

Phase II The Consultant presented his proposals for the field together with detail of drainage works which would cost £27431: he also stated that there was the possibility of the grant from the Sports Council. RESOLVED that the plan be approved with the drainage costs, that the consideration on the installation of an all-weather wicket be deferred, and that the right of way on the west of the field for Mr. Bishop be retained. Letters from Deddington Beeches Bowls Club concerning their future were noted with the hope that they would avail themselves of the facility provided for in Phase II, although they would have to consider ways and means of raising the necessary finance themselves.

Management Committee Receipt of the Accounts was reported. Councillor Webber was elected the Council representative member on the Committee. A request that the Committee have a copy of the contract with Rockwell could not be acceded to but it was available for inspection.

11. Planning applications No objections were made to (a) alterations and extension to 14 The Daedings; (b) alterations in cladding to proposed house at Clifton.

MINUTES OF THE DEDDINGTON PARISH MEETING HELD ON 25TH MAY 1988 AT 7.15 P.M.

Present: Councillor Fenemore (Chairman) and twenty-nine local government electors.
District Councillor R. Croft was also present.

1. The Chairman welcomed those present to the Meeting.
2. Minutes of the Parish Meeting which had been held on 27th May 1987 were read, confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.
3. Windmill Community Centre The Chairman gave a resume on the developments on Phase II and he answered a number of questions, in which he made it clear that the general disposal of the money accruing had not yet been considered by the Council.
4. Matters of general interest

B4031 It was agreed that a letter of thanks should be sent to the County Councillor for his efforts in getting the weight restriction for this road between Deddington and Aynho.

Bus tokens for the elderly and infirm A representative of Deddington Women's Institute elaborated on the need for the Council to issue these tokens and a discussion ensued on this and the other means of help given by minibus and the home ambulance service.

Hudson Street A discussion took place on the proposal of the County Council to make a No Waiting Order for part of this road. It was agreed that Midland Red be asked to consider the re-routing of their service to avoid using Hudson Street.

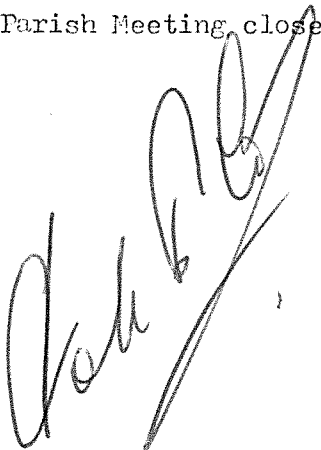
Flyposting Reference was made to the recent spate of flyposting in the Parish and the Council were asked to consider erecting further notice boards for general use in the village.

B4031 It was agreed that the County Council be asked again to place white lines on the edges of this road in the unlit stretches so that it conforms with the Northamptonshire parts.

Castle Grounds The Council Forestry Adviser answered a number of questions on his proposals for Castle Grounds, and made it clear that he wanted people to take an interest in the area.

Deddington Hill The Clerk explained that the Council had been pressing the County Council to double-whiteline the whole length of the hill, so far without success.
