

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF DEDDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON
25 th SEPTEMBER 1985

Present: C'llor Ward (Chairman), C'llors Mrs Cheeseman, Mr. Garrett, Mr. Hayward, Mr. O'Neill, Mrs. Robinson, Mr. Stevens, Mr. Webber.

Apologies for absence were submitted on behalf of C'llors Fuller, Garvey, Mackenzie and the clerk Mr Gardner.

- 1. Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on 18th September 1985, which had been previously circulated, were confirmed as a true record and signed by the chairman.
- 2. Matters arising from the Minutes of the above meeting and that held on 28th August 1985.

Dog fouling notices. It was agreed to ask for more and to place them in a higher position.

Playgroup fence. C'llor George to be asked to contact Messrs F.J. Greatbatch & Son for a specification.

Parish/CDC liaison meeting on 19th September 1985. The Chairman reported on a useful meeting which covered: Grants for Village Halls, ploughing of footpaths, bus tokens and passes, stubble burning and bonfires, coal lorries from Didcot and the dog fouling notices.

3. Items of correspondence.

New dwellings in Hempton Road. The CDC and the builders have asked for suggestions regarding a name for the new road into this development. The Council has put forward Councillor Stevens suggestion of Mill Close.

Hempton Water Supply. It was decided to support Mr Morris' effort to improve the water pressure by writing to the Thames Water Authority.

Ordinary Day of Elections in 1986. Letter from CDC read concerning the new date of 8th May 1986 to avoid a clash with the day of Passover.

Access to the Countryside. Letter read from CDC asking for our help with obstructed footpaths in the Parish. Councillors were not able to identify path CRB 13 and the Clerk is to be asked to obtain a suitable map.

USAF announcement of newsletter entitled "Envoy" reported.

CDC Official Guide. It was suggested that details of the Castle Site should be included in the new guide.

Planning Appeal Refusal for The Cottage, Chapmans Lane. Reasons for this refusal were read to the meeting.

Damaged drain cover in Tchure. It was decided to write to the Highways Dept. following a letter of complaint from Mr I.Swash of Foresters Cottage.

- 4. Autumn Tree Planting Scheme. It was decided to go ahead with the plan submitted by Mr J.Scott, (for which he is thanked), in the total sum of £195,73 incl. VAT on the understanding that half the cost will be born by the CDC.
- 5. Warriner School Governors. Mr K.Garrett is to be put forward as our nominee for a place on the Governing body of the Warriner School.
- 6. Lay-byes on A423. Councillor Garrett reported on the dirty state of these lay-byes on either side of the village. A letter is to be sent to the Technical Services Dept. of the CDC requesting a clean-up and OCC about café traders.

7. Windmill Centre. Councillor Mrs Robinson reported as follows:

- 1. The Loan Sanction for £22,000 has been granted.
- 2. Deddington News has been given a report for publication.
- 3. The District Valuer has agreed to look at the figures for the phase 2 development.

Councillor Webber reported on the nuisance being caused by children and motorcycles using the mound of top soil near the tennis courts. Hopes were expressed that this soil would soon be moved as the centre neared completion.

Thanks were recorded for Councillor R.Croft's help with the Windmill Centre project.

8. Burial Ground. Mr Stevens reported that the grave digger had left a mound of stones in the north west corner of the ground. Resolved that the grave digger be asked to remove all surplus soil and stones when graves are filled.

9. Planning Application.

11, St.Johns Way, Hempton. Flat roof extension to form dining room and WC. No objection was raised.
