

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF DEDDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 27TH APRIL, 1983

Present: Councillor Ward (Chairman), Councillors Mrs. Cheeseman, Fuller, Gardner, Garrett, George, Hayward, Mackenzie, O'Neill, Mrs. Robinson, Stevens and Webber.

Apologies for absence were submitted on behalf of Councillors Garvey and Marshall.

1. Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on 23rd March, 1983, which had been previously circulated, were confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

2. Matters arising from the Minutes

Planning application, Old Manor Farmhouse A reply from the Chief Planning and Development Officer was noted with resignation.

Highway verges A reply from the Area Surveyor was noted.

Byelaws for Recreation Grounds It was reported that the Windmill Community Centre Committee were happy with the draft already submitted to the Council. RESOLVED that these be submitted to the Home Office for approval.

3. Items of correspondence

Rubbish near Windmill Close A letter from a resident of Windmill Close was read about this problem and RESOLVED that the writer be asked to supply names before the Council decides to take any further action.

Red Lion An application to transfer the licence was noted.

Liaison with Parish Authorities A preliminary notification from the District Chief Executive that this meeting will be held on 1st September was noted for future action.

Public holiday arrangements by the District Council for May were noted.

Guided walks in District The programme, which includes one walk in the Deddington area on 11th August was noted with a view to it being publicised.

Revision to Sunday bus services No objection was raised to the proposal to revise and reduce the Oxford to Banbury service on Sundays from 29th May.

M40 Support Group The latest information sheet was noted.

4. Market stall An application from the Wesleyan Reform Church to hold a cake and produce stall under the Town Hall canopy on 16th or 23rd July was approved subject to the actual date being notified and to no liability falling on the Council.

5. Castle Grounds A report from the Clerk was considered on the question of giving assistance to the Football Club on its proposal to extend the pavilion with water and electricity provided. After some discussion, during which the possibility of the Football Club moving to the Windmill recreation ground was considered, RESOLVED that, subject to the proposed works being completed and to the pavilion remaining on the Grounds should the Club ever decide to quit for another ground, the sum of £500 be granted to the Club by the waiving of the rent for the next five years.

6. Windmill Community Centre The Chairman reported that the Tennis Club needed an overdraft from its bank of £3000 to pay for the construction of the courts, which were now completed. RESOLVED that the Council support the application, subject to no liability being incurred thereby.

7. Planning Committee It was reported that the Committee had met when no objections were raised either to an extension at 9 The Daedings or to the parking of vehicles near The Grove, subject to the use being for the occupant only and to no maintenance work being carried on there.
8. Planning applications No objections were made either to the reformation of a building into two cottages at Hopcrofts Lane, which was considered to be an improvement (Councillor O'Neill declared an interest in this application and withdrew) or to extensions at Crouch View, Hempton Road. The application to extend Windmill Stores to form a fish and chip take away food shop was considered to be an over-development of the site and would also block the access to the garage at the rear.
